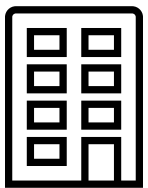
# Participant Race/Ethnicity 2013-2018

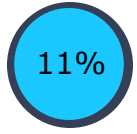
84% of families live in St. Louis City

 1% of families live in other Missouri or Illinois counties.



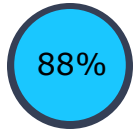
This geographic distribution across counties has remained stable for the last 5 years.



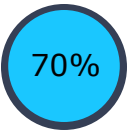
Average Family Size



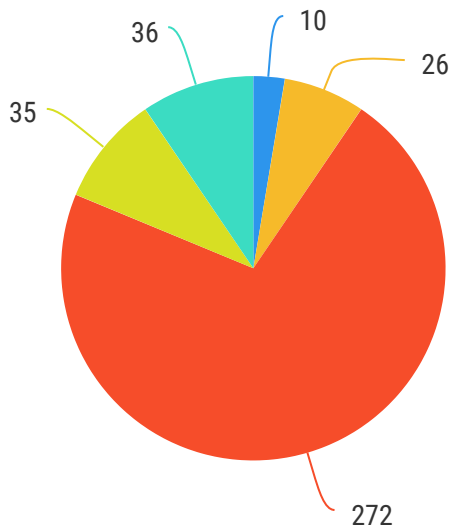
Families engaging multi-generationally



Families living below Poverty Level



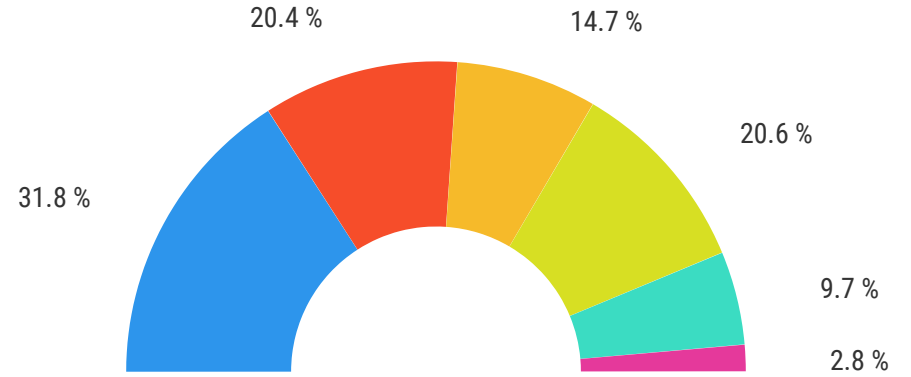

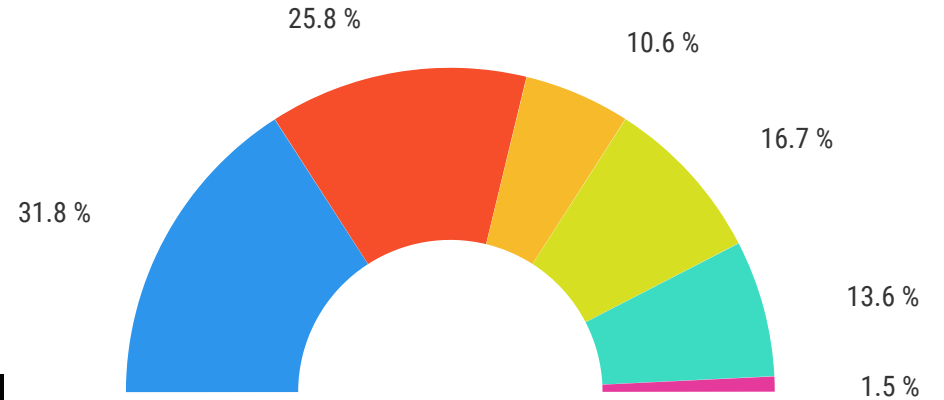

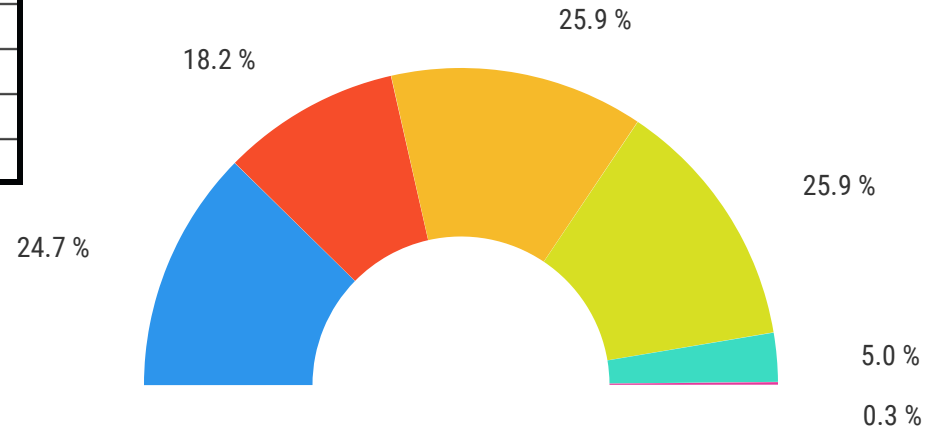
Income Distribution- Black Participants



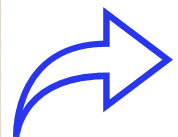
Income Distribution- White Participants
